HOW TO APPLY

Applications for any program will be accepted until program is full; however, in order to secure space and to allow proper time for processing paper-work and making housing arrangements, we recommend that you send application materials at least 45 days prior to the starting date of the program. Applications can be made in person at the IEP office or sent by mail, fax, e-mail or Internet (an original financial statement must be mailed).

Please send us the following:

1. Completed Application for Enrollment form.
2. Application fee of \$90 (non-refundable) - Please use cashiers check/money order made payable to UC Regents or credit card.
3. Two photos of yourself
4. If you need F-1 student visa (please see visa information below), also send:
 - Completed Application for I-20 form
 - Original Financial Statement from your bank or certification from a bank official on the Application for I-20 form. This can not be faxed.
5. If you need a LETTER OF CONDITIONAL ACCEPTANCE, in addition to the above, send:
 - A translated copy of secondary or university grades
 - A non-refundable deposit of \$100, made payable to UC Regents. This will be applied to your tuition upon enrollment.
6. If you want pre-arranged housing, send application form and application fee (non-refundable) for housing option desired.
7. If you are transferring from another school, also enclose the following:
 - photocopy of I-20 from school
 - copy of your passport.
8. If you are under 18 years old, you MUST provide a parental release form for emergency medical care and trip participation.
9. If you are applying for a Professional Program, complete Institutional Affiliation form.
10. For Summer Sessions applications, please request the Summer Sessions catalog.

Visa Information

Students enrolled for a program with fewer than 18 hours of instruction per week may come to the United States on a tourist visa (B-1 or B-2) or on a Visa Waiver.

Students accepted for study in any program with 18 hours or more need an I-20 form (Certificate of Student Eligibility) so that they may obtain a student visa (F-1) at the nearest United States consulate.

Although the IEP office processes I-20 applications within two working days from the date received, it may take up to several weeks for students to receive the I-20 through regular mail, depending on the destination. Please send your application for I-20 well in advance to ensure proper time to process your visa. If you send your application for an I-20 within 30 days or less from the beginning of your program, your I-20 will be sent by express mail service and you will be responsible for the \$40 fee.
